 Jotbox	Do you use your inbox as a to-do list? Jotbox is a simple app that lets you type some text, scribble a note or snap a photo and send it to yourself with one click. Drafts and Email Note to Self for Android are other great options.	\$0.99	iOS
 Clyp	Recording a quick audio note is often the best way to capture your thoughts on the go. When you open Clyp, you're presented with a button labeled "Start recording." It's that simple.	Free	iOS, Android, Mac
